FICCIT Purpose Overview -- *Kelly Rogers, Special Projects Coordinator/State Parent Consultant and Hannah Norcini, Policy and Professional Development Consultant, Florida Department of Health*

Kelly Rogers announced that as of April 26, 2018, Hannah Norcini will serve as the liaison between FICCIT and the Early Steps State Office.

A summary of the federal regulations and state statute governing FICCIT was presented. Discussion on the structure and role of FICCIT ensued.

- Members were informed the Department is working with the Governor’s Appointments Office to ensure applications have been submitted for vacant and expired seats.



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Government in the Sunshine – *Kimberly Tendrich, Chief Privacy Officer and CMS Senior Attorney, Florida Department of Health*

An overview of the Florida Sunshine Law, as it pertains to councils and meetings, was provided. Methods of compliance, vote recusals, and examples of violations were also given. Clarification is being sought if notes taken at meetings are public record.
