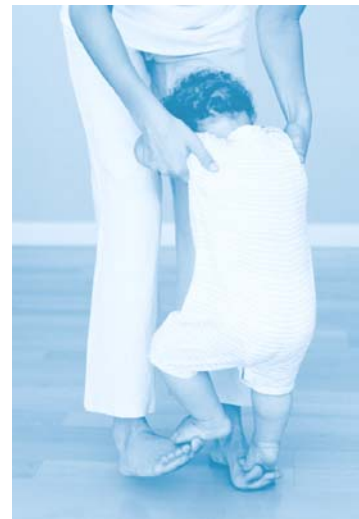

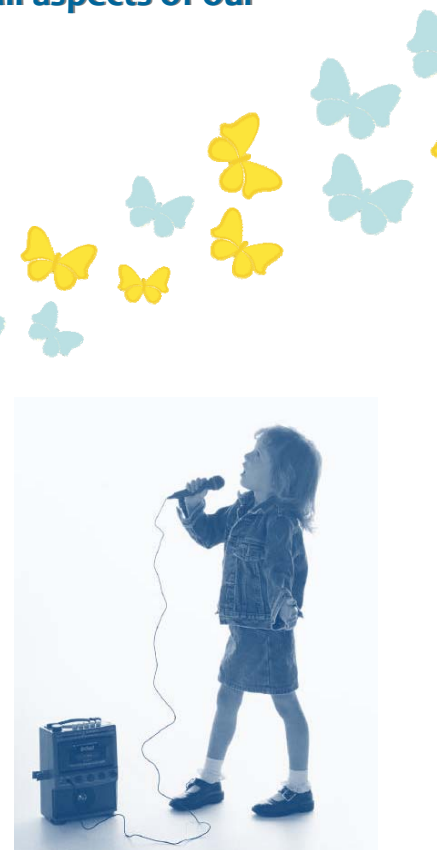

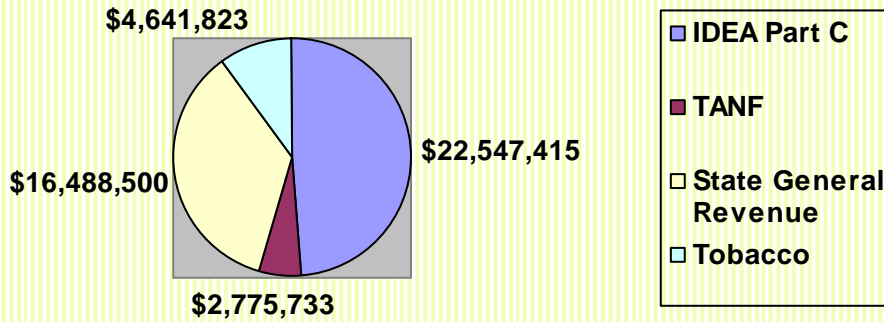

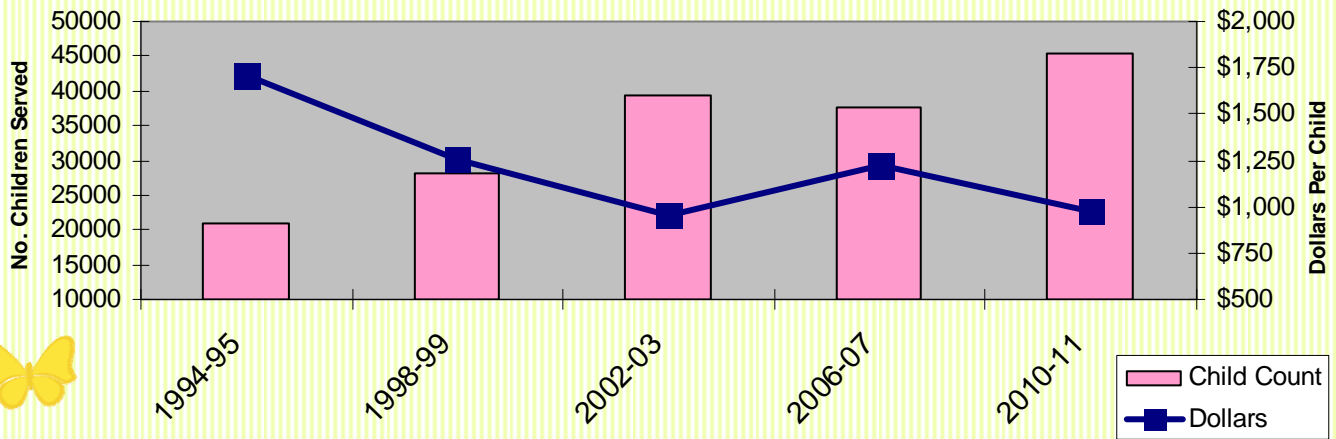
“Early Steps gave me and my family the ability to be members of our community. They gave us a voice for our child and now we are very involved in many other groups.”—Gabriela’s Story



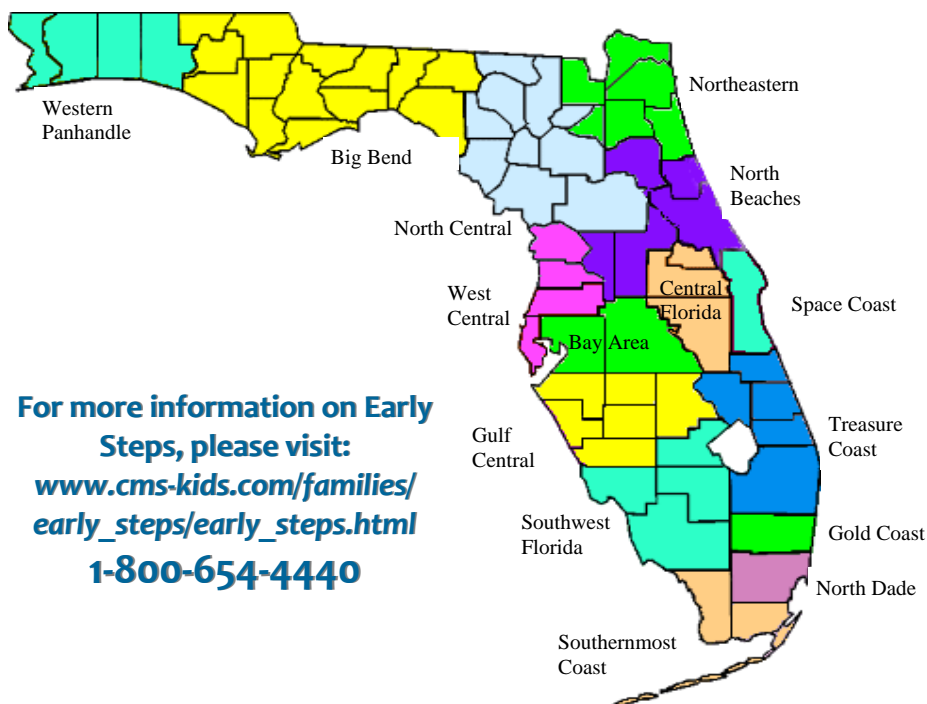
Early Steps 2011-12 Funding By Source
